With state-of-the-art equipment including a 5000 sq. ft library/media center, television and video broadcasting studio, graphic design center, and new labs for PC and Mac computers, the entire Mercy community is anxious to move in. In addition, there are new restroom facilities much closer to the newly air-conditioned Theatre, a more accessible entrance for guests with limited mobility, additional parking and renovated classroom and office space in Mercy's historic Werk Road building. 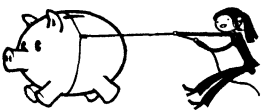

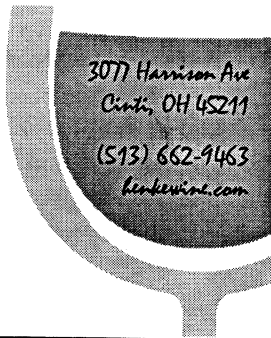


HIP Overview
