Perseverance Pays Off!

For those of us who have put up with the litter, loitering and general mayhem surrounding the S & H Market at Glenmore and Broadwell, I have great news. S & H has recently closed their doors and moved on. This *convenience* store has been a thorn in our side for over three years. The closing is due in no small part to the citizens who contacted the city through the CAGIS website <u>http://cagisperm.hamilton-co.org/cincsr/search/address.aspx</u> or called 591-6000 to report this non-caring business for various reasons. We can only hope the next tenant will be more neighbor friendly.

Summer is slowly fading into autumn and before you know it, the leaves from our beautiful trees will be covering our sidewalks and lawns. The City of Cincinnati recently decided to suspended the separate yard waste pick-up service on trash day. The regular Waste Collection crews will now take yard waste, but if you prefer to speed up the collection process and save the landfill for solid waste, you have a couple of options:

1. Take your yard waste to Kuliga Park on Bridgetown Road (plastic bags will be returned to you)

2. Start an individual or neighborhood compost bin <u>http://www.bluegrassgardens.com/how-to-build-a-compost-bin.htm</u> Both options will help the landfill issue, but option 2 will help your garden next spring!

During a recent Good Guy Loitering event, a woman approached us and thanked us for our actions. She then told us about her ordeal with a 17-year-old thug who viciously attacked her near her home, leaving her battered and bleeding. Four members of WCA, Catherine Ross, Valerie Baumann, Melva Gwen, and Mary Kuhl joined me as we attended the sentencing hearing on August 26th. Common Pleas Court Judge Steve Martin sentenced the attacker to the maximum 18 months in prison. The Judge also allowed WCA to speak in open court where I requested the offender be banned from Westwood following his release in 2010. Thanks to all the members of Court Watch as well as all our volunteers who work to make Westwood a beautiful place to live, work and raise a family.





Funding Update:

Library funding continues to worsen.

As a result of declining state revenue, our Library is now facing a \$16 million funding shortfall in 2010, a decrease of 28%. Without a steady source of additional funding we are facing the unimaginable—closure of up to **half** of our branch libraries. Does this mean the Westwood branch? We don't know. Even if it is not *your* branch, consider the impact of closing other libraries. Libraries that will remain open will also face severe cuts including reduced staffing, severe reductions in hours, reduced computer availability and a reduction in the purchasing of new materials.

Think about what closing 20 branches will mean to our community. First, there's the building itself. It's there in the heart of your neighborhood. It's a familiar place. You walk or drive past it often. Your kids go there after school. Now imagine it empty. Doors locked. Sold, perhaps even demolished.

But a branch library is much more than a building. It's also the people who work there. It's the children's librarian who leads the preschool storytime introducing a new generation of children to a love of books and reading. It's the reference librarian who knows all the good mystery writers and shares her love of good books with you with enthusiasm. That same reference librarian also helps when you need the car repair manual for your not so new car, or a magazine article to finish a homework assignment or a travel guide for your trip to a faraway destination. And if you can't go there in person, you can go there through books and the librarian's there to help with that too. It's the smile on the face of the man at the desk as he gives a young child his first library card, helps you find a book on the shelf or place a hold.

We have an outstanding public library. For the fourth consecutive time our Library is ranked among the top 10 libraries in the country serving a population of 500,000 or more. We've served the residents of Hamilton County for 156 years. Our Main Library is the busiest main library in the country. Our children, teens, and adults of all ages rely on the many services we offer. We know our Library is important to you—because you use our services and we're busier than ever with circulation on pace to increase by nearly 1 million again this year. To continue this long tradition of excellence we need adequate funding. Without it the unimaginable may become reality.


