Presidents Message-



*A major heroin bust on your street-
good news or bad news?*

Do you double-check your window latches when you hear the news?

Do you think about cancelling that morning walk?

Do you have the local real estate agent on stand-by, in case you are ready to pull up stakes?

Let me tell you how the neighbors on our street handled it two weeks ago.

We knew we had problems at that house. The signs were there. Some of the neighbors reported people coming and going at all hours of the night. There was trash piling up, and junk cars in the yard. The lawn was rutted and muddy tracks covered the sidewalk.

But instead of recoiling in fear, our neighbors did the right thing, and reported what they saw. Apparently, there was an undercover operation initiated, and the arrest was made. We looked up the property on the Cincinnati Metropolitan Housing Agency web site (cintimha.com), and it was a Section 8 house, so we reported the raid to them. CMHA immediately took action to investigate and remove the people involved from the voucher program.

THIS JUST IN!

City council is now working on an ordinance to appropriate \$250,000 to purchase and demolish vacant blighted buildings in Westwood. This is in addition to the other blight initiatives we are working on. Thanks to all of the council members who have signed on.

So- Was it good news or bad?

It was bad to have a drug dealer on our street.

It was bad to have a problem property. It was

a little scary to think about reporting the problems.

But my neighbors came through. They faced the fear, and did the right thing. Our neighborhood won this battle, and feel like they are not at the mercy of the criminals.

Our street just got better. The day of the raid was a day of celebration. We were all high-fiving and congratulating each other on doing what it takes to turn trouble away.

And we are not hiding in our houses- we are out and about, *like we own the place*. I'm proud of my neighbors.

I think it was bad news, that became great news.

We've got a lot of positive things going on in Westwood, and we are turning it around. Look in this newsletter- I had to add some pages to make room for all the good news.

Please make sure that your membership is current, and refer a friend. Then fasten your safety belt- Westwood is taking off!

Westwood Civic Association leads the way in opposing the rehab of the Fay Apartments.

For many years, the government subsidized Fay apartments have been a source of mayhem and crime on the West Side; and the trouble spreads out to the entire region. Many fear that if the Fay were closed, that all of the trouble would move to our neighborhoods. The reality is that they have a 25% annual turnover rate, so Every four years, the equivalent of the entire population of the Fay moves out anyway. That means that the trouble has been pouring into our neighborhoods for decades. It is time to take a new look at where these projects are located. It's time to take a stand for our West Side neighborhoods. WCA did just that when we voted to oppose the requested funding from the City. Please come to our meetings for more information.

A \$1,000.00 grant from Keep Cincinnati Beautiful has been approved for the purchase of 50 high-tech litter grabbers, 50 plastic buckets and 50 "I LOVE WESTWOOD" t-shirts. 

Let's get rid of those junk cars:

One of the earliest signs of blight
and apathy are junk cars left to rot
out in the open. Please call 591-
6000 for every abandoned and junk
car that you see. That includes
cars and trucks parked on the
street with expired plates and those
left in yards that meet the following
criteria:

Sec. 758-2. Junk Motor Vehicle.

"Junk Motor Vehicle" shall mean:

(1) A vehicle that has been left on
private property for more than forty-

eight (48) hours or left on a public
street, public way, or other property
open to the public for purposes of ve-
hicular travel or parking, or upon or
within the right-of-way of any road or
highway, for more than forty-eight (48)
hours; and

(2) A vehicle that is three (3) years
old, or older; and

(3) A vehicle that is extensively dam-
aged, including but not limited to any
combination of the following types of
damage: deflated, wrecked, or missing
tires or rims; missing or wrecked body
parts; broken or missing headlights,
taillights or brake lights; broken,
cracked or missing windows or wind-

shields; missing all or part of the motor
or transmission; missing or invalid li-
cense plate(s); or a vehicle that is oth-
erwise apparently inoperable; and
(4) A vehicle that has a fair market
value of one thousand five hundred
dollars (\$1,500.00) or less.

However, a "Junk Motor Vehicle" shall
not mean a vehicle stored on the
premises of an existing state-licensed
motor vehicle storage facility or a mo-
tor vehicle salvage facility licensed
under Chapter 846 of the Cincinnati
Municipal Code.

(Ordained by Ord. No. 129-2003, § 1,
eff. April 30, 2003)

I was born October 16, 1964, in Lima, Ohio. My family has farming roots in Tiffin, Ohio and Toledo, Ohio since 1839. A 1989 Graduate of Northern Arizona University, Major-Criminal Justice, Minor- History. I have been a member of the Seneca County, Ohio Genealogical Society since 1993. Hobby- collecting antique automobile license plates.

Have been employed with the United States Marshals Service, as a Deputy U.S. Marshal since August, 1990, serving in Phoenix, AZ 1990-2003, and Cincinnati from 2003-2008. As a federal law enforcement officer, I am very aware and want to be more active with the safety of our community and of our neighborhood. Problem Properties Committee



As Springtime is approaching, it is time we do some "Spring-Cleaning" in Westwood. As Westwood residents, the Problem Properties Chairman, Joel Kimmet, needs your help in policing your neighborhood and streets around your residence to keep Westwood clean, bright, and inviting to those who pass by, or those who are interested in moving into our neighborhood. The trash situation is becoming a major problem in Westwood.

Cleanup can be done in several ways: Organize a group of volunteers, and pick a Saturday or Sunday morning to go out and pick up trash along the sidewalks and streets of your neighborhood. Many children who belong to service organizations need volunteer hours for a badge, patch or project, and the neighborhood cleanup project of picking up trash is a perfect way to earn that badge or patch. The major corridors of Westwood, including Harrison Avenue, Westwood Northern Blvd, and Queen City Avenue are especially in need of trash pick up volunteers.



If you notice an especially messy or trashy property, you can report it to the city yourself, by calling 513-591-6000, you will need to give the operator the address of the property, and report the specific problem, like excessive trash, broken windows, abandoned cars, tall grass and weeds, etc, etc.

Or, you can call the Westwood Civic Association, Problem Properties Chairman, Joel Kimmet, at 513-389-0858, and report the problem property to Joel. Be sure to leave a message with your name, return phone number, address of the problem property, and the specific problem. Joel will take over, view the property for himself, and report the problems to the city for immediate action. This should be done as a last resort.


