Illegal Pit Bulls



Local Law Enforcement History

Location: Westwood First Presbyterian Church, 3011 Harrison Avenue

Come hear some interesting stories, and learn how fighting crime and keeping citizens safe has changed over the years.

Dick Gross, a 34 year veteran of the Cincinnati Police Department, will do a presentation and show and tell on the history of law enforcement in the Greater Cincinnati area.

He assisted with the establishment of The Greater Cincinnati Police Historical Society.

The mission of the Cincinnati Police Historical Society is to preserve the history of law enforcement in the area by collecting artifacts, and assembling archives and a library. They now have a museum which Dick also assisted in planning. It is located in a space adjacent to the Credit Union at the corner of West 8th Street and Freeman Avenue.

One of the curiosities you can see there is the **first police dog** in the Cincinnati Police Department (circa 1900) – and we aren't just talking about a photo of him.


