#### Presidents Message-

Well, I guess I should just come right out and say it demolition. Most people in Westwood who know me also know that I can't go very long without bringing up that topic. I know that there is much more to life than watching blighted buildings be smashed by a

huge piece of wrecking equipment. But the reason I can't stop talking about it is that there has never been a better time to undo some serious wrongs that have been foisted on our neighborhood. The current housing crisis has a silver lining for Westwood. Properties that have been in the control of the property flippers for years have reached the end of their economic rope and are now available for unbelievably low prices. Here is an example—Gobel/Bracken Woods has been deteriorating for decades. With so many multi-family units in Westwood, any plans to revitalize these streets always came to the same dead end. There simply is no market for so many apartments, and dumping money into them could not be justified. A huge redevelopment plan was rejected by the city in 2002 as too expensive. But now some of those properties can be had for less than \$10.000. The solution is to take out as many of these prop-

erties as possible, while they are cheap. As we get rid of the worst of them, the surrounding properties will have a better chance to have success with their investment. And we will be gradually chipping away at the blight. Instead of waiting for a grand redevelopment scheme, let's just take advantage the opportunities that are right in front of us.

So now you are wondering where the money comes from, and that is the point of this article.

Every year, the City gets millions from the feds that can be used for this purpose. It is our job to make sure that our city council understands that this is a once in a lifetime opportunity to turn back the blight. So call them, email them, go to city meetings and let them know—THIS IS THE TIME TO GET RID OF BLIGHT. This should be the prime budget priority for the next several years. (After basic city services such as Police and Fire, Sanitation, Water and Sewer, and Roads). We can come out of the housing crisis ahead of other cities. Then when the economy turns around, we will be sitting pretty, with plenty of development opportunities for upscale developers. It's called *Land Banking*, and we should be salting away as much land as we can while the window of opportunity is open.

And here is my favorite reason to take out blighted apartments—our great old single family homes. Most homeowners in Westwood live in older homes. Old homes take plenty of time and money to maintain and upgrade. There isn't enough government money in the world to fix up all these homes. It will only be done by thousands of homeowners using their own money to live the American dream. And we cannot attract self-sufficient motivated homebuyers with all the blight surrounding them. If we want people to invest their life savings in Westwood, they need to have a reasonable expectation that our neighborhood will be moving forward.

And that's why I can't stop talking about demolition...

Please make that call to city council soon. Blight removal should be priority one for Cincinnati.

Western Hills Revives Mock Election Tradition Today

To bring the election process closer to students and the community, Western Hills Design Technology (a pre-Engineering High School) will revive the Mock Election that predicted Congressional, Gubernatorial, and Cincinnati City Council and other winners in years past. The Mock Election at Western Hills began in 1976 by well-known West Side resident and social studies teacher Charlie Beaty, but was discontinued when the school was reorganized 5 years ago.

Current Principal Virginia Rhodes and Social Studies teachers Brad Smith and Jennifer Lewis-Thornton are reviving the tradition by having students organize a Mock Election during the school day on Thurs., Oct. 23. They have planned, will conduct, oversee the election, count the ballots, and announce the results.

West High students accurately predicted Charlie Luken's victory over Ken Blackwell in the 1990 Congressional race for District 1, and George Voinovich's election as Governor over Tony Celebrezze in the same year.

Will students predict for Steve Chabot to keep his seat in District 1, or throw their support to Steve Driehaus, the challenger? Will the school still mirror the Cincinnati electorate by correctly predicting the outcome of the presidential race?

"It's an election year that can really help students connect with the process of active citizenship," said Principal Virginia Rhodes, "and we believe student leadership development is critically important." Western Hills Design Technology High School is a 9-12 STEM school, featuring a pre- Engineering program that prepares students for post-secondary opportunities in Engineering and other STEM-related programs.


