President's Message

If you can read this, thank Becky Weber. Becky took over as publisher of our newsletter- Westwords. Becky has also been lining up new advertisers and I'm sure you have noticed all the new ads. Please remember to shop our advertisers whenever possible. Thanks Becky, for doing a great job.

We have many issues on the table, as you will see throughout the newsletter.

The Cincinnati Public School Board ruled against us on the Westwood school addition, and they intend to build it on the Harrison Avenue side of the existing building. WCA's position is to build the addition on the Epworth side, to try to keep the historic district looking nice. We still have a small bit of hope that we can prevail with the city, since they need approval from the zoning department in order to build it on either side. We have taken up our case with them. If you have any ideas on reversing the decision of the school board, please let us (and them) know. (See story on page 2)

Our new Westwood Strategic plan is now ready to be taken out of committee, and moved forward toward passage by the city. Having this document in place should help to prevent confusion about how we want our neighborhood to look going forward. It should save us a lot of time fighting for/against projects that might benefit or hurt our neighborhood. For example, with the Montana Avenue project, we could have saved two years of meetings, hearings, and hundreds of emails, if we had a clearly stated policy on road improvements. We will be discussing our new plan at our regular meetings, so please join us.

Speaking of Montana Avenue, we are once again meeting with the Department of Transportation and Engineering to implement the "Road Diet" concept. After all this time, it looks like we are really going to get the project we want- three lanes instead of four, a narrower footprint, and a safe, efficient, pedestrian-friendly road.

One more thing- The federal government is getting ready to dump many millions of dollars into our city. We need to be ready with a plan on how best to spend the money in Westwood. We need to make sure that this money helps improve our neighborhood. (continued on next column)

We will continue to fight for blight removal as a top priority. We are currently making a street-by street inventory of blighted properties in Westwood. We will be working with the city to get rid of as many of these (non-historic) blighted buildings as possible. Our long -term goal is to have 60% owner-occupied single family homes in Westwood. We currently have 40%. Demolishing blighted apartment buildings, and only allowing new single-family homes will go a long way toward this goal.

WESTWOOD TO RECEIVE FEDERAL FUNDS

Westwood is one of 10 neighborhoods selected to receive federal funds through the Neighborhood Stabilization Program. The City combined data from the Department of Housing and Urban Development and City Sources. Based on criteria established by the City and HUD, Westwood and nine other neighborhoods will receive these funds.

The city will focus on the following eligible uses of these funds:

- Financing mechanisms for purchase and redevelopment of foreclosed upon residential properties
- Rehabilitation of homes and residential properties that have been-abandoned or foreclosed upon in order to sell rent or redevelop these properties.
- Demolition of blighted buildings

Members of the Westwood Civic Board have been canvassing all of Westwood to identify these properties. You may have seen one of the board members walking through your neighborhood. Don't be alarmed. They are out there identifying properties that we may be able to have rehabilitated or demolished through this program.

Westwood School Centennial Celebration Liz Kissel



Westwood School Update...

On January 12, 2009, after members of WCA attended the Cincinnati School Board meeting to persuade

the board not to construct the new addition to Westwood School on the Harrison Avenue side of the school building, the board decided to

vote against WCA. (WCA wants the addition on the Epworth side of the school.)

One of our board members attended a meeting on January 26th to reiterate the position of Westwood Civic Association, the school board decided they had no reason to change their position.

Cincinnati Public School board officials stated they would not require any variances or zoning changes in order for the building to be built on the Harrison side of the school. However, a request for a variance to this property for fence height, fence opacity and signage was submitted just two days later. WCA is opposing this zoning change.

TOM BONHAUS AUTO SERVICE

It is often said that good help is hard to find. The purpose of this article and others like it is to highlight the many businesses that call Westwood home.

I first heard of Tom Bonhaus Auto Service from dropping off my sister in-law to pick her up or drop her off for her car repairs. She always spoke highly of the quality of service and professionalism. I grew to know him from various civic activities. Tom is the kind of person that the more you know him, the more you like him. Even the most ill-tempered would find difficulty trying to find something bad to say about him.

Tom Bonhaus Auto Service is located at 3151 Harrison Avenue, where he has been since February of 1983. For the past twelve years, he has been assisted by Mr. Royce Long. Mr. Bonhaus previously operated a service station at the corner of Queen City and Boudinot, the current location of a United Dairy Farmer, where he opened his business in 1973 during the gas shortages. He was at that location until 1980, when the location became cost prohibitive.

I asked Mr. Bonhaus if his vocation was a family tradition, and was surprised to learn that it was not his first career selection. His father was a man of mechanical ability, but had a "dim view of garage work." He had aspirations of white-collar work for his son. Tom made an effort to be a part of that world, earning a B.S. in Administrative Science and Marketing. He secured a white-collar job after graduation; but when his child failed to recognize him after an eight-day business trip, this caused Tom to desire a change in vocation where he could be closer to his family. This inclination coupled with a longtime desire to own his own service station, was the origin of Tom Bonhaus Auto Service. The field of car repair has allowed Tom Bonhaus thirty-five years of self-employment, and plans to pursue that vocation for at least five more years.

Adorning the wall of this service station are two photographs that captured my attention, forcing me to inquire about them. The first is a picture of a group of gentlemen in a garage setting that includes the father of Mr. Bonhaus. His father told him to hang it up to give the impression that Tom was a second-generation mechanic. The second photo is from his original location, and features Tom, a Texaco sign freshly taken down, and an AAMCO sign to be put up. His father, whom intended the picture to document the end of the Texaco era, took the photograph. When Tom relayed this story to me, the significance of the photographer seemed to greatly overshadow the moment captured.

Mr. Bonhaus could not express enough to me that he loves what he is doing and "truly enjoys fixing cars." He also asked me to express how grateful he is for the "customers and patronage from the people of Westwood."

Montana Avenue Committee Formed

Curtis Hines from the Department of Traffic and Engineering attended our January 20th Westwood Civic Association meeting. Mr. Hines requested a committee be formed to discuss the implementation of the "Road Diet" to Montana Avenue. The committee will include members from the Civic board, residents of Montana Avenue and representatives of DOTE.

The committee will determine if there are sections of Montana Avenue that can accommodate alternating on-street parking or bus niches without impacting residential properties. The result should be a safe, pedestrian friendly neighborhood street that improves the livability and quality of life for all its residents.

New Mercy Hospital

Mercy Hospital announced they will build a new hospital on a 60 acre site on North Bend Rd. near Interstate 74 behind St. Ignatius Church.

Mercy Hospital still needs approval of local governments and its own board.

The new hospital will replace both Mercy Franciscan, Western Hills and Mercy Franciscan, Mt. Airy.

This new location hopes to make the hospital more accessible to everyone and gain access to more patients from Hamilton County's Westside.

The current hospitals located in Westwood and Mt. Airy may offer doctor offices, ambulatory care facilities and clinics, however final decision is yet to be made.


