She has enthusiastically formulated new ideas and plans for fundraising and increasing membership. She is also working with City Officials to put some teeth into the Chronic Nuisance Ordinance.

Mevla Gwen and Mary Kuhl, co-founders of Westwood Concern, take much time from their jobs to attend meetings and speak on behalf of Westwood. They take a lot of grief for being outspoken in their beliefs, but this has not diminished their resolve. Mary and Melva volunteer for many committees and events all year long.

Trent and Sharon Lewis attend every meeting of the WCA and are involved with the Westwood School Renovation project as well as the Montana Avenue widening project. They also chair the District Three Resource committee and the Neighborhood Support Program funds.





DID YOU KNOW IT'S ILLEGAL

Did you notice all the ugly signs that keep popping up on the utility poles? Did you know it is illegal? The Cincinnati Municipal Code states in section 911-17 - Posting Bills on Streets: no person shall post or affix to any pole or other structure on any street, avenue, alley, park or public ground of the city, any handbill, card, circular or other printed material.



Whoever violates this section shall be guilty of posting bills on streets, a minor misdemeanor.

Unfortunately, a police officer must witness the offense taking place to prosecute. Therefore, if we all take them down as soon as they go up, call the number on the sign and tell them to not place signs in our neighborhood and call the police if you see someone in the process of putting them up, we can nip it in the bud. So if you are out and about help by taking them down.


