President's Message:

I'd like to update you on some activities the Westwood Civic Association has been involved with in the past month. Many volunteer hours have been expended in efforts to make our neighborhood just a little nicer.

A committee led by Becky Weber and Chris Kearney has met with police and city officials to jump start the languishing Chronic Nuisance Ordinance. I have included the link at the bottom of this text for you to read the ordinance. As a result of their diligence, the Cincinnati Police stated that fines have gone out to some property owners. WCA will report which properties have received fines once CPD supplies us with the documentation.

Recently, a small group led by Mary Kuhl attended and spoke at the Cincinnati Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) meeting. Of concern was the high number of calls for service

at the housing units occupied by folks who receive subsidized rent from the taxpayers. CMHA officials were advised they too are subject to the Chronic Nuisance Ordinance, but they feel they are exempt. We'll see about that!



Melva Gweyn and Sr. Ann Rene McConn attended a seminar in Nashville Tennessee relating to the Form Based Codes. This idea is a long tern vision of how business districts should be designed for effectiveness and aesthetics.

On the housing front, Jim McNulty continues to persuade the City to eliminate blight by demolishing the dilapidated multi-unit apartment buildings in our neighborhood. On the other hand, WCA sent a letter to the City requesting they relax their approach to demolishing single family houses which may have hope in rehabilitation when the housing crisis eases.

Spring is just around the corner and as the weather turns favorable, I would like to ask the volunteers who have litter routes to again police their areas with great vigor. If you would like to get involved in the litter removal program, stop in the meeting on February 16th at the historic Westwood Town Hall at 7:00 PM. Remember, all first timer attendees get an *I Love Westwood* t-shirt! You won't get that at a City Council meeting!

The housing market is beginning to turn up in Westwood. And your tax returns will help you with your down payment! If you or someone you know would like to purchase a home, a certificate of homebuyer training is often required by mortgage lenders.

You can earn this certificate from Working in Neighborhoods, Inc. located at 1814 Dreman Avenue, just a short drive from Westwood. There is no charge for the classes. The classes are led by professional loan staff, real estate agents, insurance providers, home inspection and others—everything you need to know about purchasing a home.

February classes are Tuesday, Feb. 2, 9, and 16 and Saturday, Feb. 6. March classes are Saturday March 6, and Tuesday March 2, 9, and 16.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

The current constitutional language places the responsibility of excusing a board member of absences from meetings on the recording secretary. The amendment requires a majority vote of board members present to excuse an absent member for good cause.

Whereas attendance at Westwood Civic Association meetings by its elected board members is an important responsibility, and

Whereas criteria for an excused absence is rather vague and arbitrary, and

Whereas the responsibility for determining an excused absence rests solely with the Recording Secretary, and

Whereas matters of this importance should be shared equally by the board members present at a regular membership meeting,

Therefore be it resolved that Title IV, Article VI, Section 2 be amended to include the following first sentence, "Board members will be deemed absent unless excused by a majority vote of the board members present at the regular monthly membership meeting" and deleting the phrase "without adequate excuse presented to the Recording Secretary prior to each meeting"

The new Title IV, Article VI, Section 2 will read as follows:

Section 2. Board members will be deemed absent unless excused by a majority vote of the board members present at the regular monthly membership meeting.

Absence of a Director for three consecutive meetings shall be cause for the Board of Directors to declare the position held by such member to be vacant.
