JAMES N. GAMBLE HOUSE FACES POTENTIAL DEMOLITION

The grand Victorian home located at 2918 Werk Road, fondly referred to as the Gamble House by local resi-



dents, is being scheduled for potential demolition, perhaps as early as March of this year. Various efforts are underway, fueled by massive public support to stop the demolition and the situation seems to change daily. Part of that effort is the process that is underway to have the home receive a local historic landmark designation (a City of Cincinnati designation which is taken into consideration when owners apply for demolition permits). By the time this reaches your mailbox, much may have already happened - hopefully to secure a future for the house. An amazing number of people have been following the progress of this situation through the Westwood Concern website and a Facebook account.

Ownership of the property was transferred in August 2009 from the Louise Dieterle Trust to the Greenacres Foundation. Faced with two minor city code violations (peeling paint and a sidewalk in need of repair), the owners of the property have decided not to comply with the orders against the house and have begun taking bids for its demolition because the house was not part of their overall plan to use the property and outbuildings for nature

education programs.

Although the history of the property dates back to the early days of the village of Westwood, it is most often associated with James Norris Gamble, son of the co-founder of Procter & Gamble, who lived in the house

from 1875 until his death in 1932. Some of Mr. Gamble's accomplishments during his time of residence at 2918 Werk Road include the invention of Ivory Soap, helping to found the United Way, funding the construction of Nippert Stadium at the University of Cincinnati, overseeing the construction of Ivorydale, funding Christ Hospital and financing the construction of its world-class Institute of Medical Research, modernizing the Cincinnati & Westwood Railroad, helping to construct the Westwood Town Hall and the Westwood School, helping connect the Western Hills with the city proper, funding the construction of the Methodist Church in Westwood (and playing a role in the financing of nearly every church constructed in the Western Hills during his lifetime), and hiring Thomas A. Edison to develop the



forerunner of the teletype machine. One of the first telephones to ring in the village was Mr. Gamble's. The first sidewalks in Westwood were laid in front of the home at 2918 Werk Road. Mr. Gamble was the last mayor of the Village of Westwood before its annexation into the City of Cincinnati. He fought in the Civil War, and helped found the Freedmen's Aid Society after the war. Well-loved and respected by all, Mr. Gamble collected several fond nicknames during his lifetime of work, including "Builder of Churches," "Patriarch of the Western Hills," and "Cincinnati's Grand Old Man.".

Olivia Gamble, daughter of James N. Gamble and Margaret Penrose Gamble, was the last family member to live in the house full-time. Olivia died in 1961; from that time until 1992, the house was perfectly preserved due to the efforts of Louis & Louise Nippert, even earning the couple an award for historic preservation in 1991 from the Miami Purchase Association. It is clear from research and the recollection of local residents that the home continued to receive proper maintenance at least until 1997 - perhaps even as recent as 2000-2001, due to the continued efforts of Mr. Cecil Harry, the long-time caretaker for the house and grounds. At sometime prior to 2006, the maintenance and repairs on the house stopped and the once-grand structure has been in a state of decline ever since.






