#### **Gamble House Update**

This is a critical time in the effort to save the James N. Gamble house. The two most important things the community can do now are: 1) raise money, and 2) keep the fight on the public radar screen.

Hopefully by the time you read this, Greenacres Foundation will have responded favorably to Cincinnati Preservation Association's (CPA) offer to buy the house for fair market value. <u>IF</u> the house is important to the community, and <u>IF</u> the community can acquire it through CPA, then the money to buy, restore and maintain it will have to be raised or the house will likely be razed.

Given its historic significance, there is a good chance that some of the money can come from grants and foundations but often that money is restricted for specific uses, and generally can not be used toward an endowment. Realistically over time, we need to raise a total of \$2 million dollars from all sources (to include an endowment), but \$500,000 is needed fairly soon to purchase and stabilize the house, and begin restoration work.

An endowment is needed to generate income for routine expenses (utilities, security, etc.), ongoing repair and maintenance, and for infrastructure replacement in the future (new roof, etc.). Generally for every \$1 million dollars in an endowment, at 5% interest, \$50,000 would be generated annually. Ideally the capital would never be touched and would actually be added to over time.

Is it doable? It is up to the community.

It is difficult to convince people to donate when the house's future is still in limbo. But if the Greater Cincinnati community truly wants to save the house, it needs to demonstrate to Greenacres its willingness to raise the funds to acquire and maintain the house long term. To that end, pledges would help demonstrate that we are committed to saving the house (payable only if CPA buys the house).

Raising \$500,000 could be as simple as gifts from a few very generous people (5 donations of \$100,000), or a lot of people contributing modest amounts (20,000 people giving \$25 or 5000 giving \$100) or, more likely, a mix of contributions. Stock donations can also raise a significant amount of money and provide tax benefits to the donor (extra P&G shares anyone?). In addition, a wide variety of fundraising efforts can generate money with help from lots of volunteers.



#### WOULD YOU LIKE A FREE TREE????

### CINCINNATI PARK BOARD FALL RELEAF PROGRAM 2010

#### TO QUALITY:

- 1. Property must be in the City of Cincinnati.
- Trees must be planted within 30 ft of the rightof-way or visible from the street. Planting between the street and sidewalk and in backyards is not acceptable.
- 3. Plant the right tree in the right place. Please consider the mature size of the tree. Be aware of any obstructions from wires, utilities, or other structures

A high priority is given to planting trees on private property along streets the Park Board cannot plant due to narrow right-of-ways. The Park Board encourages such streets to coordinate delivery and planting for interested property owners.

Other priority areas include community focal points such as entranceways, street triangles, areas near street intersections, and public frontages along major streets.

Forestry staff will inspect each planting location before approving tree requests, and will inspect locations after planting to ensure guidelines are followed. For more information go to www.cincyparks.com

Recycle and reduce the amount of solid waste your household throws into the garbage. The
City of Cincinnati provides this list of items that can be placed in your recycling bin. Familiarize yourself and educate your family on what you can recycle. Spend some time setting up a
recycling system in your home. See if you can reduce your amount of weekly waste by one
garbage can size.

Below is the current list of recyclable items for the City of Cincinnati's recycling program. Please call 591-6000 with any questions.

#### Acceptable Items

- NOW Accepting all plastic bottles and jugs (no lids)
- Glass jars and bottles of any color
- Aluminum, steel and bi-metal cans
- Empty aerosol cans with lids and tips removed
- Brown grocery bags
- Computer paper, and other mixed office paper
- Corrugated cardboard, broken down to 3' X 3'
- Envelopes, with or without windows
- Junk mail
- Magazines
- Newspapers with inserts
- Paperboard, such as cereal boxes
- Telephone books
- NOW Accepting pizza boxes (free of food residue)

#### Unacceptable Items

- Plastic that are not bottles or jugs, such as whipped topping containers, butter tubs, yogurt cups or food trays
- Plastic bags
- Motor oil jugs or other chemical containers
- Styrofoam
- Lids/caps
- Window or drinking glass
- Light bulbs
- Coat hangers or steel scrap
  - Paint cans


#### **Westwood Historical Society Meeting**


