# Rousing Support for the Gamble House

The Livable Communities Committee came to Westwood on November 3, to conduct a public hearing on the possibility of the City exercising eminent domain to take the James N. Gamble house. Despite relatively short notice, word got out via e-mail blasts, flyers, news coverage and word of mouth. Close to 300 people packed Midway School, many standing in the hall. It was an incredible turnout. They came from Westwood, Cheviot,

Bridgetown, and Monfort Heights. They traveled from Downtown, Kentucky, Clifton, Kenwood, Mason, College Hill, and yes, Indian Hill. Not everyone there supported the idea of eminent domain but the majority supported the idea of saving the house, and their very presence conveyed that message to the Committee and to Carter Randolph from Greenacres Foundation who attended but did not speak at the hearing.

About two dozen people gave heartfelt testimony about the importance of the house. Some even shared family antidotes about Mr. Gamble. Each person had a unique take on the same message – Save The House. If sincerity and numbers impress the folks in City Hall, they had to have been impressed.



A big thank you to everyone who came and to those who helped to get the word out. In particular, Bob Prokop's flyer and pleas through the Save the Gamble House Facebook group were very instrumental in bringing people to the meeting. And speaking of thanks, now is a good time to send e-mails and letters to the committee thanking them for holding the meeting in Westwood and encouraging them to continue their efforts to help save the Gamble House.

#### **Next Steps**

The lawyers in the City Solicitor's office will work through the legalities of whether all the elements exist to jus-



tify the taking of the house and/or the entire property by eminent domain. If they determine the conditions exist, Council will hold another hearing to vote on whether to proceed, so watch for another opportunity to show up in force, probably at City Hall. There are a number of steps that then must be followed and court hearings that take place. In other words, it is a long process. In the meantime, we will continue to appeal to Greenacres to sit down at the table with Cincinnati Preservation Association and the community to come to an agreeable resolution.

**John Sess** with some of the students cleaned up around the Montana exit at 1-74 which really benefited from their efforts.



# Book Club - Thursday November 18 at 7:00 pm - Adults This month's selection is Reading Lolita in Tehran by Azar Nafisi


