### President's Message:

2011 was a banner year in Westwood, and 2012 can be even better. (Please see the list of accomplishments and goals in this newsletter.) Our level of activity is high, and our tireless volunteers never seem to

run out of ideas to improve our neighborhood. But we need more people to get involved. We need you. I would hope that each of our residents could set aside a little time each month just for the betterment of Westwood.

Over the past several decades, our neighborhood has seen growth, prosperity, decline, despair, anger, action, volunteerism, renewal, and a new hope for the future. Somehow, it seems that the perception of Westwood around the region is often negative, even though we know better. I recently saw a comment about the Gamble house, and the writer could not understand why anyone would want to save any building in "that" neighborhood. Some of those perceptions might change if they spent some time here. They would see people walking their dogs, pushing strollers down tree-lined streets, or talking with their neighbors. Or they might see children walking to school, shoppers shopping, and people working in their yards. In other words, we are living our lives in Westwood, and it's a wonderful place to be.

We just need to continue to accentuate the positive, and eliminate the negative. That is why we must fully implement the **Westwood Strategic Plan**. (You can view it at westwoodcivic.org) A part of the plan is to reverse the 60/40 ratio of rental/owner occupied housing, but there is much more. Westwood School will re-open this year. Our plan calls for making this a premier (magnet) school, so our children and grand-children don't have to travel for a decent public education. For the 2010-11 school year, Westwood School had the following 8th grade student proficiency percentages - Reading-69% Mathematics-41.4% Science-27.6%. That is unacceptable for a school that bears the name of Westwood.

Another goal is to work with the Cincinnati Police Department to develop a formal plan to address specific

goals related to quality of life and safety issues. That process is well under way, and we will be meeting with CPD Chief James Craig to discuss and implement it.

The city of Cincinnati will be finalizing a new comprehensive city plan this year, and we need to make sure our plan is incorporated into it.

Another very important project we need to tackle this year is to re-activate our CourtWatch Program. Court-Watch is a process of tracking criminals and advocating for our neighborhood in the justice system, making sure that crimes are properly prosecuted. It requires some computer work, some organization, communicating with prosecutors, and sometimes going to court to follow cases through the system. It's a program that works by showing authorities and criminals that we will not tolerate crime, that we are paying attention to the cases, and that we expect results.

And let's not forget the incredible **Westwood Citizens** on **Patrol Program**. These volunteers patrolled our streets for more than **ELEVEN HUNDRED HOURS** during 2011.

There—now you have it—plenty of opportunities to get involved, and we welcome your ideas. Come on out to a meeting—the third Tuesday of every month, at 7PM. We will try to make the meetings interesting and as short as possible.

### What has the Westwood Civic Association done for you in 2011?

Many times changes occur around us in a gradual manner. We see the final result, but forget what went into affecting the change. During the past year, your Westwood Civic Association (WCA) has been involved in many projects designed to improve your quality of life. As the New Year begins, let's look at some of the accomplishments of 2011 and also look at the plans for the upcoming year(s).

### ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2011

- WCA was instrumental in the new fire house to be located on Harrison near McHenry. The new house will include an ambulance.
- Westwood Block Watch has expanded to include more than a dozen streets.
- After many serious accidents, WCA helped to get a 4-way stop at Lischer and Epworth Avenues.
- We instituted several neighborhood clean-up projects, including Epworth Court, Glenmore & Glenway and Glenway & Boudinot. We also did a clean-up in East Westwood.
- The Westwood Community Garden is well underway with more than half the beds rented.
- The Westwood Art Show (3rd annual) was the biggest and best yet!
- WESTCURC was successful in acquiring the Bell Building (Epworth and Urwiler) for the new home of the MADCAP Puppet Co. currently on Glenmore Avenue.
- b WESTCURC purchased, remodeled and resold several single family homes in the "summit" of Westwood.
- We have been working to clearly establish the official boundaries between Westwood and our surrounding neighborhoods.
- Several blighted apartment buildings have been demolished at the direction of WCA.
- Board members have donated many volunteer hours to the St. Catherine Festival, WESTFEST and other community events.
- With dogged persistence, WCA saw City Council pass the new Chronic Nuisance Ordinance 9-0.

### PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

- We look forward to the completion of the Montana and Harrison Avenue restructuring projects.
- WCA plans to work toward reducing multi-family apartment buildings and increasing the number of single family homes on larger lots.
- We anticipate the re-opening of Westwood School as a premier learning center that our neighborhood can be proud of.
- We plan to start an advertising campaign to tell potential homeowners that we are here, we are building a great community, and we have your new home.
- We look forward to the construction of the Bracken Woods Lane single-family housing community.

If you are an energetic and concerned resident interested in giving back to make our neighborhood better, please get involved with your WCA. We are a dynamic group interested in making things happen. We meet monthly on the third Tuesday at 7:00 PM at the historic Westwood Town Hall.

### **WESTWOOD COPP**

If It Looks Like a Duck. . .

One of the ways that everyone can make Westwood a safer neighborhood is to be aware of what is happening on the street where they live. If a vehicle pulls up and someone is sitting in the car, they might be taking a cell phone call. But, just as likely, they may be casing the neighborhood or waiting to make a drug transaction. If the person in that car does not lives in your neighborhood and they are there longer than seems reasonable, get a description of the vehicle (color, make, model, 2-door or 4-door, or any other identifying features, such as tinted windows or a dented bumper) and call District 3 (352-3574). In our training as Citizens on Patrol members, we learn that if "it looks like a duck, swims like a duck, and quacks like a duck, then it probably is a duck." So, if something doesn't look right on your street, it probably isn't! Contacting the police gives them a reason to question that person idling their car on your street. If that person is casing your neighborhood, waiting to make a drug transaction, or stalking someone. then it pays to call the police before the crime occurs. By making that telephone call, you are making Westwood a safer neighborhood.

### **Wood Fires Can Cause Harmful Pollution**

It's that time of year when it's most tempting to curl up next to a warm fireplace. The crackle and sizzle of a wood fire on a cold winter night can be charming, but be sure to consider the implications on air quality before lighting a fire. Wood-burning produces smoke containing fine particles called particulate matter (PM) that can affect both the lungs and the heart.

Smoke released from wood-burning stoves and fireplaces omits large amounts of PM because the wood is a solid, making it difficult to burn completely or efficiently. The size of the particles released is linked to their health risks; the smaller the particles, the greater the potential for them to get deep into the lungs or even enter the bloodstream. Long-term particle pollution exposure has been linked to a variety of problems, according to the U.S. EPA, including:

decreased lung function irregular heartbeat development of chronic bronchitis increased respiratory symptoms, including irritation of the airways, coughing, difficulty breathing

In fact, wood-burning fireplaces omit the greatest amount of PM into the environment over other heating sources. Cleaner heat options, such as electric heaters, gas or oil furnaces or pellet stoves are good alternatives to burning wood in a fireplace. If you do choose to use a fireplace, be sure you use dry, well-seasoned wood to reduce the amount of PM released and maintain a hot fire.






