Westwood Citizens on Patrol

Seen Any Broken Windows?

One of the guiding theories for Westwood Citizens on Patrol is the "Broken Windows Theory." Developed by social scientists James Q. Wilson and George L. Kelling in 1982, the "Broken Windows Theory" describes a downward spiral created by just a few panes of broken glass:

"Consider a building with a few broken windows. If the windows are not repaired, the tendency is for vandals to break a few more windows. Eventually, they may even break into the building, and if it's unoccupied, perhaps become squatters or light fires inside. Or consider a sidewalk. Some litter accumulates. Soon, more litter accumulates. Eventually, people even start leaving bags of trash from take-out restaurants there or breaking into cars."



This theory was put to the test in 1993 after Rudy Giuliani, newly elected mayor of New York City, allowed the police commissioner to adopt this approach under the rubrics of "zero tolerance" and "quality of life." The rest, as they say, is history, and New York crime rates plummeted for the next ten years.

Here in Westwood, Citizens on Patrol adopted the "Broken Windows Theory" fourteen years ago when we first formed as a unit. In addition to radioing in crime, we tackle such quality-of-life issues as abandoned cars, graffiti, litter, illegally posted signs, and burned-out streetlights.




Hw effective have we been? Well, in 2001, we would typically write-up anywhere from one-to-four abandoned cars on *every* patol. Today, we are hard pressed to find even one. In 2001, our first "long-walk litter pick-up" on Harrison Ave. between Hansford and Epworth yielded eighteen large trash bags. Our patrol pick-ups are lucky to get six large trash bags. And when crime happens, Westwood Citizens on Patrol members are trained how to describe subjects and radio it in.

Hear ye! Hear ye! Hear all about the History of the Cincinnati Enquirer

It is sometimes hard to remember that everyone depended on printed newspapers for their news before the age of television and the internet. The first issue of Cincinnati's sole surviving daily paper, the Cincinnati Enquirer, was printed 173 years ago on April 10, 1841. At the April 9 meeting of the Westwood Historical Society, Jeff Suess of the Cincinnati Enquirer will take us through the history of the paper. Along the way we will learn how the story of Cincinnati newspapers overlaps with the history of the city of Cincinnati. Jeff, whose articles on local history often appear in the Cincinnati Enquirer, is the Enquirer librarian. He will also discuss resources available for doing research. The meeting begins at 7 pm at the Westwood First Presbyterian Church, 3011 Harrison Avenue. All who are interested are welcome to attend.

Hamilton County's Yard Trimmings Drop-off Sites

The Hamilton County Recycling and Solid Waste District's free yard trimmings drop-off sites will open on Saturday, March 29.

This program is for Hamilton County residents only. Residents who drop-off yard trimmings must bring proof of residency, such as a driver's license or utility bill. Landscapers and commercial establishments are NOT eligible to participate in this program.

Locations:

West: Kuliga Park, 6717 Bridgetown Road in Green Township

North: Rumpke Sanitary Landfill, 3800 Struble Road (and Colerain Avenue) in Colerain Township

Hours:

All sites will be open March 29 - November 23, 2014, on Saturdays and Sundays, from 11:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. All sites will be closed on Sunday, April 20.

Guidelines:

Landscapers and commercial establishments are NOT

eligible to participate in this program

Hamilton County residents only

No large trailers or trucks larger than pickups

Cut brush and tree branches into lengths of 4 feet or

less-must not exceed 1 foot in diameter

Bundle brush and tree branches with a material such as

twine—must not be heavier than 50 pounds

Bring yard trimmings to the locations in containers or

bags-brown paper bags preferred

Containers and plastic bags will be returned

No pallets, boards, nails, fence or wire accepted

No bricks, stones or soil accepted

All children must stay inside vehicles

This board appears to be completely dysfunctional. I do believe there are individuals who are doing an excellent job moving the community forward, but are being bullied by those who are afraid of change. I'd like to offer a few suggestions to the group:


