First off, I'd like to set the record straight...WESTWOOD IS NOT LEAVING THE CITY OF CINCINNATI, at least not yet. A committee of dedicated, hard working volunteers has decided to look into the possibility and all the ramifications of seceding from the city. Obviously this is a huge task requiring much research and discussion with all the parties involved. Stay tuned for further details.

Westwood has some exciting events planned for the next few months. The August 18th meeting will feature Valerie Daly of the Planning Department. The City of Cincinnati is in the process of developing a new Comprehensive Plan and Valerie will discuss the future plans for our city. Input from the citizenry will be appreciated.

At the September 15th meeting, Chris Rose, the president of the Rookwood Pottery Company in Cincinnati will give a presentation on the history of the famous company and how the Westwood area is richly represented with Rookwood pottery fireplaces and other adornments. This is an opportunity to bring in your pieces of Rookwood or photos of your fireplaces and get your questions answered.

Also on the horizon is the first annual Westwood Arts show to be held at the historic Westwood Town Hall grounds in early October. Although still in the planning stages, the event will showcase local Westside artists, musical talent, a wine tasting from the award winning Henke Winery and maybe a farmers market. Westwood has joined forces with the Price Hill Civic Club to co-host a Candidates forum for the local political races this fall. Mother of Mercy High School will be the venue, however the date has not been finalized at this time.

**Westwood, Ohio-Population 35,000** How does that sound to you? What if Westwood could go back to a system of home rule, and have more control over our own neighborhoods' destiny? What if we had our own zoning board, and building department? Could we deal with creeping blight more effectively if we kept our government closer to home, and more focused on Westwood issues? What if we had our own economic development department, to fill up our shopping centers and business districts? Could we build on the great foundation we have, and build a better, more prosperous, cleaner, safer neighborhood? Does our association with the city help us more than hurt us?

What about the down side? Who would take care of Police and Fire services? How would the tax money work? Who maintains the roads? Where does the money come from? Isn't it very complicated to de-annex from the City? Can I still tell people I'm from Cincinnati?

There are many opinions pro and con, and more questions than answers. At the July meeting of the Westwood Civic Association, the board voted to <u>explore</u> the idea of our neighborhood seceding from the city. We did not vote to storm 801 Plum Street and declare independence. There are no lanterns in the bell tower at Westwood Town Hall signaling- "One if by Harrison Ave! Two if by Montana!" It's simply an idea to be explored, to see if it might take us in a new direction, and help us tackle some of our more persistent neighborhood challenges.


This has set off a flurry of emails, blogs, press releases, and news stories. Why would Cincinnati's largest neighborhood, annexed into the city in 1896, want to do such a thing? It's a bad idea! It's a great idea! It will never work! It just might work! It's complicated! It's needed!



We need to keep exploring new ideas, and searching for better ways to secure the future of this wonderful neighborhood. But don't worry, no one is trying to drag your neighborhood in a direction you don't want it to go, and nothing will change unless there is approval of the majority of the neighborhood. And either way, we will still be the "Capital Of The West Side". Let's talk about it, and see where it goes.



#### Funding Update:

The State budget signed into law on July 17 reduces the percentage of tax revenues going into the Public Library Fund from 2.22% to 1.97%. While this is estimated to be \$84.3 million over the State biennium, the amount could either increase or decrease depending on actual State revenues. This latest cut is an 11% further reduction in Library funding and while very difficult, is less than the 30% cut proposed by the governor. We thank you, our users, for contacting our legislators with thousands of emails and phone calls. These messages did make a difference. We deeply appreciate your actions in voicing support for public libraries.


