From The President's Desk:

Greetings Westwood Residents! For the next few months, in this President's Column, I will be highlighting each of Westwood Civic Association's Committees. Last month, in the August Issue, I wrote about the Properties, Buildings and Development Committee, and interviewed Chairman Jim McNulty. This month, our "Committee Spotlight" is on the School Enhancement Committee. This Committee has two co-chairpersons, Karen Strasser and Jill Minor. I recently interviewed Karen and Jill about this important Committee, and I also visited a recent Committee meeting, where I learned that this Committee has been very busy and involved in our neighborhood.

The School Enhancement Committee members to date are Karen Strasser, Jill Minor, John Sess and Jim McNulty. This Committee is seeking additional new members at this time.

The Committee's responsibilities include: our Annual Westwood Student of the Year Awards Presentation, working with Westwood School and Midway School to encourage these schools to become premier schools, attending CPS School Board meetings to become active participants in decisions effecting Westwood, serving as the LSDMC for several Westwood schools, and supporting school fundraising efforts. The goals of this Committee are to expand on the responsibilities listed above, and to promote activities and events at our schools.

The Annual Westwood Student of the Year Awards Presentation: This awards presentation is held at the Westwood Town Hall each May for Westwood students in grades 1 thru 12. Nominations are accepted from counselors, teachers, principals and administrators for one student from each school who has shown exemplary school spirit, civic-mindedness, leadership, volunteerism, and community involvement in activities and events. Westwood Civic Association recognizes the students and their family members by hosting the annual awards presentation at the May General Membership Meeting at the Town Hall.

"Celebrate Westwood" Event, September 29, 2012: The Celebrate Westwood Event is a new event for 2012. On Saturday,


Sept. 29th, from 1:00 pm thru 4:00 pm, we will be celebrating the reopening of Westwood School after a long refurbishing and remodeling project. This event will feature an "Open House" at both Westwood School and the Westwood Town Hall. Events will include BBQ food from the grill, building tours every ½ hour, demonstrations of programs at Westwood Town Hall, visits by members of Cincinnati Police SWAT, mounted horse patrol, canine unit, Cincinnati Fire Department, Citizens On Patrol, and other events occurring on the grounds. If this sounds interesting to you, and you would like to become more involved as a volunteer for the Westwood schools, please attend a Westwood Civic Association meeting, and speak to Karen Strasser and Jill Minor about joining and getting involved in this important Committee. Congrats to the School Enhancement Committee for getting involved and proactive in helping our Westwood schools to become greater institutions of learning for the future of our neighborhood.



12 Popular Misconceptions about Westwood Citizens on Patrol (COP)

1. Westwood Citizens on Patrol puts its members in danger.

Since the inception of Westwood COP in 2001, no one has been hurt or been put in danger. We patrol in groups of three, always with a police radio. Members patrol only where they feel safe.

2. Members of Westwood Citizens on Patrol are vigilantes, taking justice into their own hands.

COP members never get involved or confront anyone. We are extra eyes and ears for the Cincinnati Police Dept.

3. Citizens on Patrol members are naive about what is really going on in Westwood.

Members of COP go through a background check and twelve hours of training at the Cincinnati Police Academy. At our patrol meetings we receive regular updates from the Cincinnati Police Dept.

4. While patrolling members of Westwood Citizens on Patrol are armed and carry weapons.

No COP member is packing heat or carrying a concealed weapon while on patrol.

5. The Citizens on Patrol program has not been that effective in reducing crime in Westwood.

COP has been very successful at both deterring crime from happening and reporting crimes in process. We also address quality of life issues, stolen vehicles, missing children, and clean-up projects.

6. There is a certain type of person who joins Westwood Citizens on Patrol.

COP members come from all walks of life. Our youngest member was 19, our oldest member is 82. Our diversity represents a cross-section of the neighborhood.

7. Members of Westwood Citizens on Patrol are a tight-knit group and have known each other for years.

Every year COP loses members. Some leave the

neighborhood, others resign to take care of an elderly parent or to battle a life-threatening illness. Each year new members are welcomed into Westwood COP.

8. You must be physically fit to endure the long walking patrols in Westwood.

We have stationary, walking, and vehicle patrols. We tailor patrols to the physical capabilities of the members. Some patrols are brief, others are long.

9. Westwood Citizens on Patrol share extreme political beliefs.

The COP program is not political, and we do not discuss politics. Our members hold diverse political beliefs.

10. To join Citizens on Patrol takes a large commitment of cash and time.

There are no dues or training fees to join the unit. The minimum commitment is one patrol per month.

11. Joining Westwood Citizens on Patrol will involve a lot of meetings.


We have a weekly patrol meeting that lasts less than an hour. Members are required to attend one meeting a month. The emphasis is on doing—not talking.


12. Westwood Citizens on Patrol is already active and doesn't need my participation.

Our effectiveness is based on how often we patrol. Westwood is Cincinnati's largest neighborhood with over 30,000 residents. For every 1,000 residents, only 1 is a member of COP.


