


Join WCG for our kick off and seed exchange!

In the Very Beginning: Early Westwood Settlers

Wednesday, March 14, 7:00 pm
Westwood First Presbyterian Church
3011 Harrison Avenue (enter from Koenig Ave)

Westwood officially dates back to when it was incorporated as the Village of Westwood, September 14, 1868, but folks settled in the southeastern part of what would became Green Township since the earliest days of the 19th century. Slowly resources have been unearthed that give us a glimpse into the lives of some of those who chose to settle here. We hope to have several items to display from the Craig family who are credited with establishing Cheviot in 1818. Part of that platted town is now part of Westwood and much of the property they owned is in Westwood...think Craig Avenue. (Free and open to the public!)

Wild, Wild Westwood: Cincinnati's 1899 War on Westwood's Saloons

Thursday, March 22, 7:30 pm

West Side Brewing (3044 Harrison Avenue)

Newly annexed by Cincinnati, Westwood was a headache for the City's police department in 1899. Rowdy saloons at the end of the Westwood streetcar line were the cause. Greg Hand will tell the colorful saga involving Boss Cox, rigged elections, a Civil War colonel, bloody streetcar brawls, competitive bowling, and ragtime music. Learn how law and order came to Westwood, and why Cheviot decided to incorporate. (Free and open to the public!)




