
WESTWOOD CIVIC MEETINGS



The **Westwood Active Transportation Study** is 100% funded by the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) through an application by WestCURC, where we were one of the 4 selected applicants of over 60 applications that were submitted. State wide crash statistics has shown an alarming trend of increasing pedestrian and bicycle crashes throughout Ohio. As such, ODOT has piloted the four Active Transportation studies in an effort to identify locations of needed pedestrian and bicycle improvements. The goal is after the study is completed, the identified projects will be moved forward for additional funding for implementation.

The study area is bounded by Epworth/Ferguson to the west, Harrison to the east, Urweiler to the north, and Dunham recreation center/Sunset Avenue to the south. The Town Hall Park and Westwood Elementary School users predominately live in the study area, yet only a few walk or bike to these facilities.



ODOT has hired Toole Design Group, a nationally recognized bicycle and pedestrian planning firm, for this project. Join us on Monday, May 21 from 7 to 9 PM at Westwood Town Hall for the kickoff meeting for the neighborhood to identify problem areas for pedestrian and bicycle connectivity. The consultant will be in town reviewing existing conditions and meeting with smaller groups throughout the week. On Thursday, May 24, from 7 to 9 PM, the wrap up presentation will be held at the Westwood Town Hall. Toole Design Group will summarizer their findings and ask for final feedback.

Eyewitness to Pearl Harbor: One Soldier's Story

Walter Oka, a Hawaiian native was 13 years old when he witnessed the attack on Pearl Harbor. He was a witness to the beginning of World War II for the United States as he saw the capsizing of navy ships and felt the shock waves created by the massive explosions. In 1946, at age 18, he enlisted in the US Army to serve in the Medical Corps in Japan. He was assigned to Military Intelligence Service (MIS) and became part of the 353 Interrogation Team. Mr. Oka will present his life story. The personal account of Pearl Harbor and the events that followed are a testimony to the sacrifices that have been made to protect our freedom. Thoughts to keep in mind as we approach Memorial Day. All are welcome.


