February was an exciting month for Westwood.

The Cincinnati Public School Board announced that James N. Gamble Montessori will move into the old Mercy High campus. CPS is using our tax dollars as we speak to renovate the Mercy High building. By the time students begin class this coming August, several million dollars will have been invested in the property. I think its great when our money comes back to our neighborhood and when a school in our neighborhood has the opportunity to move into a proper high school campus. The Gamble students are extremely excited and we all need to step up to support Gamble students to do their best learning (maybe become a mentor or volunteer in a way that suits you). No school can thrive without community support.

We all remember that Nation Kitchen and Bar was selected by the City to open a restaurant at the old Firehouse on the corner of Junietta and Epworth. That was months ago, but after passing through several different committees and finally full City Council, the firehouse was officially sold to Nation Kitchen and Bar. Nation will now begin the long process to renovate the building and property. If I was a betting man, I would say next spring we could see the restaurant open (though they are pushing for sooner than that).

Westwood Town Hall grounds is still on schedule for completion this spring (probably June). My kids are pretty excited to try out the new playground!

On the pedestrian safety front. The City Department of Transportation and Engineering shot down our initial efforts to have a traffic light installed at Mustang and Montana due to traffic count data (not enough cars turn in or out of the street to warrant a light per current standards).



We understand that the residents want a light there to slow traffic and not to allow more cars to come in and out of Mustang. Councilman Landsman is working with us and DOTE to find a resolution. Westwood Coalition has also asked Mayor Cranley to look into installing parking bump-outs along Harrison in the business district, reduce the speed to 25 mph along Harrison in the BD, install lighted crosswalks at Westside Brewing, Harrison and Bracken Woods, Montclair and Harrison, and crosswalks to allow safer access across Westwood Northern into Mt. Airy Forest.


