

We are excited to see what is being planted in the raised bed organic gardens by our new and returning gardeners. As of now we have:

- plots rented 41 plots open 19
- garden rows rented 2 garden rows open 10

There is a new straw garden area pioneered by Stu Golder that hopefully will be planted after Mother's Day with a variety of squash, melons, pumpkins and gourd plants with any resulting produce to hopefully be donated. Planting into a deep bed of straw keeps the weeds down and moisture in so less watering is needed. People are welcome to help with that project. The hops growing up on the two arbor gates are coming along fine thanks to Fred Leymann's efforts.

The Gazebo Project spearheaded as an Eagle Scout project by Payton Lynch is coming along slowly with all the rain interfering with getting the 14 piers finished that will support the gazebo.

All library locations will be closed on Monday, May 27th in observance of the Memorial Day Holiday. We thank all of our fallen soldiers for their dedication.




