

Maria Longworth Storer: From Music and Art to Popes and Presidents



Maria Longworth Storer is best known as the foundress of Rookwood Pottery, the first female run manufacturing company in the United States - a very unusual success story for a woman of her time. To that end, she was recognized this year as one of 5 new inductees in the Greater Cincinnati Business Hall of Fame. Her legacy, however, extends well beyond Rookwood.

Maria was very instrumental in helping to cultivate the cultural heritage that Cincinnati enjoys today, including the May Festival. She also became involved in social justice issues. Her influence was felt not just locally but nationally and internationally through her connections to diplomats and world leaders. This other side of Maria is generally overshadowed by her pottery fame.

Local author Nancy M. Broermann along with co-author Constance J. Moore from Texas collaborated on a book about Maria after having done extensive research. They will share the story of this remarkable Cincinnati woman at the Wednesday, November 13 meeting of the Westwood Historical Society. The meeting starts at 7:00 pm. All are welcome. Copies of their recently published book, *Maria Longworth Storer: From Music and Art to Popes and Presidents*, will be available for purchase.


