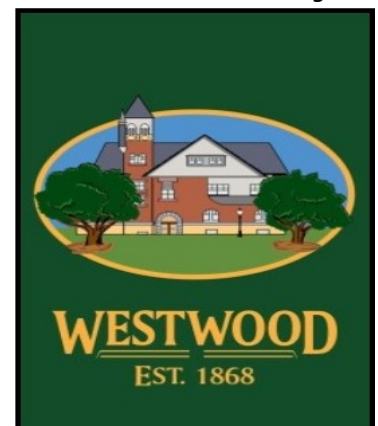

Our speaker will be Tom Connor, PhD, a retired university professor and government researcher, who took an interest in architects Joseph and Bernard Steinkamp after he bought Joseph Steinkamp's home in Price Hill. He has been doing extensive research into which homes and buildings are attributed to the brothers with the goal of writing a book on their life and works. Many of the homes he located are in the Price Hill and Delhi areas but a few Westwood homes have also been identified.
