

In spite of the cold wintery days, one's thoughts can imagine the first possibilities of spring as we begin planning for the garden season at our Westwood Community Gardens. Located at 2163 Harrison Ave. Cincinnati, OH 45211 at the corner of Talbot, it is a place that is inclusive and will allow all people, regardless of age or ability, to share in the joy of gardening. The Gardens will give back to the community by providing education to Westwood residents about growing their own flowers and produce.

Most importantly, the Westwood Community Gardens will be a beautiful space that all neighbors can feel proud of and enjoy. Our gardens are all organic and our core team gardeners can help others maintain that standard. Each 4' x 8' plot cost \$25 per garden season to rent, with a maximum of 2 beds per family.

Now that we have our new Gazebo we plan to have a number of programs this year on gardening topics. Check our Facebook page Westwood Community Gardens for information.

All gardeners are expected to contribute at least 10 hours over the gardening season to help maintain the overall garden area- mulching, weeding, mowing, watering, planting in the community herbal & flower border gardens and other tasks.

Hear about one person's approach to finding her ancestors. Westwood native Phyllis Uffmann caught the bug when she came across an old family photo from 1909. Fortunately her mother had neatly written names on the back to identify everyone.

But who were these people? What was their story? Those questions started Phyllis on a quest. When the trail got cold, she shifted gears and steered her search on a different course. Come and hear how her family story came alive as she pursued the usual as well as some unusual genealogical resources ... including hiring someone to help her navigate research in Germany and to take her to places in the Old Country significant to her family's story.

While not a "how to do genealogy" session, if you are contemplating getting started you'll get a feel for some pros and cons of different resources available. 
