We believe the levy is vital in order to get the Western Hills Viaduct replaced as well as in providing our residents an affordable and dependable mode of transportation around the city and county. By supporting this levy we encourage the residents of Westwood to vote in support as well on March 17th.

Westwood Civic is also working to ensure that Police District 3 is staffed fairly in comparison to the other police districts in Cincinnati. We believe our district is understaffed by around 20% and we are working with City Council to resolve this issue. Our letter to Vice Mayor Smitherman and statistics is attached.



Excited to share the news that the City of Cincinnati's Urban Agriculture Program has awarded our Westwood Community Garden with a \$900 grant. This will help us purchase organic garden supplements to enrich the soil in our 60 raised beds so that each gardener has the best growing opportunity. Some of the funds will also go to fix a few of the wooden beds that need to

be repaired after 9 years of service. Thanks to volunteer, John Lewendowski, for his help in filling out the grant forms.

The Westwood Community Gardens is accepting applications for 4'x8' plots and 17' farm rows for the 2020 growing season. Here is our <u>WCG plot application</u>. Our goal is to add 30 new gardeners to make use of the 60 organic beds, farm rows, herb gardens and fruit trees and create a vibrant, engaged group of gardeners.



Roving Trash Truck: There will be a roving trash truck circulating through the neighborhood servicing all corner cans and collecting excessive trash and illegal dumped items.

Note: This is not another trash collection day.

Litter Picking: Staff will be on foot litter picking main thoroughfares and heavily littered areas.

Private Lot Abatement Program (PLAP) Staff will abate privately owned properties that have been cited for litter, high grass and overgrown brush violations. Staff will notify the community a week before the blitz begins.




