Our Westwood Anti Racism Initiative

Westwood Works will be starting the Our Westwood Anti Racism effort this spring. It will involve engaging residents in:

- 1. Education about race and racism in Westwood and America
- 2. The opportunity to participate in a six week learning journey called "Courage to Connect" facilitated by The Hive Center for Community and Contemplation
- 3. The Big Read- An opportunity to read age appropriate texts on anti-racism and participate in discussion and action groups
- 4. The creation of at least one Anti-Racism Free Little Library
- 5. Westwood Works Mini-Grants. The RFP will focus on Black Led Ideas, applicants must live, work, worship or go to school in Westwood. The application will be released in February 2021.

Just before the "Pandemic" shut down everything in March 2020, we celebrated our 20th anniversary with a dinner at Henke's Winery. We were told in March that all Citizens on Patrol activities were suspended until further notice. So we have not been able to patrol or meet in person since then. We did start meeting again via Zoom in November. This has helped us stay in touch with District 3 and our current members. It has also given us time to think about what we can do while still not officially patrolling. We can call in or use the Fix It Cincy app excessive dumping or furniture sitting at the curbs for too long. We can take signs down that are hung on telephone poles or that are in the right of way. And not only we can do this—all citizens can do this. Our next goal is to actively recruit and one way we can do this is to hold an informational Zoom meeting on the last Thursday of February.
