News from the Garden

Thanks to the generosity of others, we have 3 scholarship beds available this year at the garden, one donated by one of our long time gardeners, Joan Smith who also has the asparagus bed in the farm row at the garden. The other 2 were donated by Gigi Fioresi in memory of her grandfather Arturo Baptista Fioresi. She emailed me:

"My grandfather lived on Feltz Ave my entire life. He grew all types of fruits and vegetables including a live fig tree. I've often driven past the Westwood Community Garden but had no idea who to reach out to-this means a lot to me. Thank you!"

The scholarships are available for new gardeners in our community who may need help paying \$25 for the raised bed (4' x 8') for the entire growing season and would like to try organic gardening. They would be a member like everyone else with the same responsibilities and fun times. If you know anyone who would be interested have them email me their contact info at wcg.coordinator@gmail.com and we will draw the three winners on April 15 - Please share this info with others in our community.

The great news is that we have many new gardeners signing up this year. Out of our 60 raised beds, there are still 10 beds and 2 farm rows available to rent and our gardeners are already starting to plant peas and other early greens in their beds. Each gardener gets a bag of Mushroom Compost, Revita and straw for their beds as well as a selection of seeds are available, Everyone is welcome to plant whatever they wish in their beds- vegetables, flowers and things that will fit well inside their bed.

Updates and Reminders from Your District 3 Police

The D3 police reported at our March meeting that crime rates continue to fall in District 3 which includes Westwood. Year-to-date reported crimes are the lowest they've been in four years. Shot Spotter has been installed in Westwood and is working well, but fewer calls are being made now when shots are fired. Residents are encouraged to call and report if they hear shots fired. The combination of resident calls and Shot Spotter data helps the police to narrow in on the location for more efficient response.

Calls for Service—The police encourage residents to make calls for service to report incidents or crimes. Calls for Service help police do their job in a number of ways. The frequency of calls for a specific location or issue creates a record of data for the police department to analyze and identify hot spots and persistent problems and community concerns that helps the police know where to focus their attention resources. If you see suspicious or frequent problematic activity call the *non-emergency number 513-765-1212* even if the police aren't able to respond in time. For crimes in progress or when immediate response is needed call 911.
