Cincinnati's Vision Zero Program for Pedestrian and Bike Safety Kicks Off May 1

The city of Cincinnati is launching a citywide billboard campaign May 1 to raise awareness about pedestrian and bicyclist safety. The month-long campaign is timed to coincide with the start of warmer weather when more adults, teenagers and children are spending time outside. Residents will notice 35 billboards throughout the city, reminding motorists to yield to pedestrians at crosswalks, and to give bicyclists three feet of space when passing. The new safety and awareness campaign is one of the strategies in the City's Vision Zero program – a commitment to reduce and eventually eliminate traffic fatalities. "We're building our transportation network to help make everyone feel safe, whether you're walking, bicycling, or in a car. Education is a key component of that effort," said John Brazina, Director of the Department of Transportation.





Stop by and see our new storage shed at our Westwood Community Gardens (2163 Harrison Ave. --NW corner of Harrison and Talbott Aves.)! Thanks to the City of Cincinnati Safe & Clean Neighborhood Fund, we received a grant to help us purchase a kit for this shed, new cedar wood to replace some of our 11-year-old oak beds that needed replacing and some straw for mulching our beds. We needed a shed to store all of our tables, chairs, tents, and supplies for gatherings at our garden. Our hope is to have more workshops, potlucks, and events for our gardeners and the community in the future. Thanks to John Lewandowski for helping to secure the grant and to Joel Kimmet, with his garden assistants Haley Huge, JC Statt, Stu Golder and others who helped with the construction. Next up is painting the exterior of the shed and the floor.


