We meet in person at Westwood Town Hall and stream the meetings on Facebook for people to watch live or later. Meeting minutes are posted on WCA's website. We are a public body subject to public input. The abovementioned projects and many others are often discussed for months before they are endorsed or opposed by the board. There are public meetings to discuss rough plans. Committees are formed to hammer out details. Letters of support or opposition are drafted. Councilmembers, local organizations, the press, and ideally, Westwood residents are all involved in the process.

If you were surprised by an announcement, or wish you had more opportunities to contribute, you should get involved. Volunteer with the board. Attend a neighborhood clean-up. Lead a committee. You'll be shocked how much you can learn and do for a few hours a month! So far, we're 35 strong and growing, but we still need you!
