

#### WESTWOOD CIVIC ASSOCIATION December 2021 TREASURER'S REPORT

#### Coming Soon...Westwood DORA (Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area)

#### Status:

The Cincinnati City Council unanimously approved the Westwood DORA (Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area) on December 15. There are a number of steps that still need to happen before this becomes a reality:

- There is some work still to do with the City to formalize agreed upon relationship between the City and Westwood Civic Association. The City will then apply for State of Ohio approval
- We will be gathering additional input from residents, beyond the hundreds we have involved to date, in order to gather any additional suggestions or concerns to further enhance our implementation plans
- There's still some work to do on signage in Westwood Town Hall Park on the playground gate and Town Hall building entrance... this signage and boundary and business window signage would then need to be put in place

We are hoping we can implement a soft opening sometime in early 2022, possibly as early as late January. Based on temperatures, volumes would be low and we can train business staffs, work out any kinks, and address any concerns that arise before Spring. In early Spring, the plan is to organize a grand opening event when it's a little warmer.

#### **Background:**

The goal of creating a DORA District in Westwood is to help continue the momentum of revitalization here in Westwood by furthering efforts to make our Westwood Town District a destination, help our businesses prosper, attract additional businesses and future residents, and further activate the recently renovated Westwood Town Hall Park. From a stakeholder perspective, we worked closely on the design of our DORA with local business owners, community groups, hundreds of residents, and nearby churches and schools to garner support. Business owners and every one of our community groups wrote letters of support, including the Westwood Civic Association board which voted unanimously to support the DORA. We have also worked closely with a number of City groups including District 3 Police, CRC, Parks, DOTE, Community & Economic Development and Public Services. Cincinnati Police District 3 is fully supportive and has developed plans to ensure its success. Further activating the district and the park, they feel, will further reduce crime and increase safety by ensuring more activity and "eyes on the street".

#### (Westwood DORA, cont.)

We have defined our proposed DORA area to be a tight, controllable area that does not include any sidewalks bordering churches, schools or residential properties. We have defined our proposed DORA hours based on input from key stakeholders (5:00 pm to 11:00 p.m. Monday – Friday and Noon – 11:00 p.m. on weekends). We are not trying to replicate the Banks, Cheviot or other larger DORAs. We have defined the Westwood DORA to uniquely fit with what Westwood is all about as a neighborhood. More similar DORA models would be those in Loveland or Milford. Discussions with and visits to other municipalities surrounding Cincinnati that have DORAs gave us confidence, not only in the benefits of a DORA, but also in our ability to introduce and manage a DORA effectively in Westwood. These other DORAs have experienced benefits, but no issues. A standing DORA Management Committee will be formed under the Westwood Civic Association to ensure this remains true for us as well. For some, having a DORA in place has been incorporated into their marketing

well. For some, having a DORA in place has been incorporated into their marketing campaigns and websites to attract additional visitors and development to their business district.

Our experience with the temporary ability for restaurants and bars to add sidewalk and park seating, and serve drinks there, due to COVID-19 gives us confidence that a DORA can be implemented without any issues. We experienced zero issues over the nine months when that model was in place. The flexibility provided by that option was a lifesaver for those businesses. A DORA allows such benefits to continue even beyond COVID-19 and provides even more flexibility for businesses than those temporary measures provided. Instead of being served drinks in the park by business employees, customers can walk the drinks over to the park themselves or elsewhere within the defined DORA area. Drinks just need to be put in a specially marked DORA plastic cup. If there's a long wait at a restaurant, a customer can either wait there, or get a drink in a DORA cup and hang out in the park or possibly browse at retail shops with a drink in hand (for those shops that want to participate) until they're texted that their table is ready. Signage will be put in place to make it clear where the DORA area ends in every direction. Signage will also be placed in the windows of businesses indicating who is participating in the DORA and who is not. Signage also will include QR codes, with a link to a specific page of the Westwood Civic Association website (westwoodcivic.org/ dora) which will provide more information including a map of the DORA, a list of participating businesses and the rules for the DORA. The page will also provide an option for feedback of suggested improvements or issues. This page is available now, although it is a work-in-progress and is being further enhanced.

#### Map of Westwood DORA Approved Areas

The Westwood DORA (Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area) spans the Westwood Historical Business District, as highlighted in green on the map below. The Town Hall building and Town Hall playground are excluded from the DORA, as alcohol is not permitted in these areas.



#### We Ain't Talkin' Trash and Neither Are Werk Road Neighbors

In Westwood Civic's two litter pick-up events of Fall 2021, we took 2,303 gallons of litter and 60 gallons of recyclable items off of our neighborhood streets. We are also forging partnerships with the Kroger corporation as well as the Ferguson Ave. Kroger, Western Hills Home Depot, Western Hills Target, LaRosa's, Price Hill Safety CAT, and Western Hills University High School. Sgt. Hicks and Officer Minnelli's guidance and support have been invaluable. Jincey Yemaya of CRC has been incredibly helpful, and we hope that the teens in her CRC programs will join us at the next event. So far, we're 35 strong and growing, but we still need you!

If you would like to build pride in our neighborhood, make a difference in the lives of your neighbors, and have a blast while doing so, join Westwood Civic for litter pick-ups from 11:00 AM-1:00 PM on the following Saturdays:

- January 15
- February 5
- March 5

We will meet in the Westwood Town Hall parking lot and disperse to other locations around the neighborhood from there. Litter pickers, gloves, safety vests, and bags will all be provided. In the event of below freezing temperatures or precipitation, we will need to cancel. Email notifications will be sent to all who sign up for the events.


Thank you to everyone who supported the Garden in 2021. Our gardener community contributed a combined total of 832 volunteer hours last year to maintaining the garden grounds!


